A message from Fr. Steve:

Are you ready?

We are entering one of the most exciting, emotional, and lifegiving times of the year. Of course, I am speaking about Holy Week, which begins with Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem. Hosanna in the highest! The Messiah, the King of Kings, the



King of Israel, has arrived and is entering the city. The people welcome him with joy, waving palm fronds and cheering the arrival of the long-awaited Savior. The moment of fulfillment has come—this is Palm Sunday.

As we move deeper into the week, we prepare our hearts and minds with a foundation of peaceful reflection. Welcome to the Service of Taizé—an opportunity to quiet our thoughts and center ourselves for the sacred days ahead. Through meditative singing and prayer, we create space to reflect and prepare for what is to come. Taizé invites us into stillness, guiding us toward the profound moments of the week ahead.

Next, we witness Jesus offering his final teachings. The Son of God humbles himself as a servant, kneeling to wash the feet of his disciples. In this act of love, he models true humility and grace. Then, he establishes the Last Supper, the new Passover, instituting the Holy Eucharist. He breaks the bread and shares the cup—his body given, his blood poured out. This is the foundation of grace, a covenant of love that will endure forever.

From there, we swiftly enter the arrest and capture of Jesus—the beginning of his Passion. Good Friday stands as a solemn reminder of Christ's ultimate sacrifice, the gift of his life for our sins, the Atonement. We observe the Stations of the Cross, walking with him in his suffering. Through the powerful music of our esteemed Musical Director, David Ripley, we are drawn into a moving and, at times, captivating service of reflection and contemplation.

From here, we wait—the anticipation builds as we approach the Easter Vigil. This sacred service begins in darkness, with the lighting of the Paschal Candle, symbolizing the light of Christ breaking through the shadows. Then, as the tomb is opened, light fills the space, and we proclaim, 'Hallelujah! Christ is risen!' 'The Lord is risen indeed!' It is a celebration of life, a joy that continues into Easter morning. All praise and glory to God for the gift of His Son, for the resurrection, and the life He brings. This is a time of new beginnings, a transition into hope, a new dawn, a new day, a new life. Easter—the most sacred of all days in the Christian calendar.

Won't you join us for Holy Week? We invite you to prepare your heart and mind for a journey that will uplift you, fill you with light and love, and open your heart in profound ways. Come and experience Holy Week and Easter with us. Join in the beautiful liturgy of the Episcopal Church here at Trinity.




The Book Club Saturday, April 12th



In this heartfelt story about finding love in loss, three widows are forced under the same roof, where they'll need to overcome grief, anger, and old secrets to put their family back together.




The May featured book is: West with the Giraffes by Lynda Rutledge


Stations of the Cross Friday from Noon to 3:00pm
